## HEALING RETREAT

(COMMENTS FROM MONSIGNOR RAUN AND DEACON TOM)

Our conference held a "Healing Retreat" last month beginning with the celebration of Mass followed by a presentation given by Monsignor Raun. Monsignor was very inspiring. He holds the ministry of St. Vincent de Paul in high regards with a special place in his heart for all the work the Vincentians at St. Thomas do for our community. If you couldn't attend, here are some of the things Monsignor mentioned in his reflection. First of all, making home visits is so important in bringing Christ to someone. He said we should always ask, "May I pray with you?" Always leave a prayer book with the applicants, even if they are not comfortable praying during the home visit. When we pray from our hearts, things happen, and healing happens.

Always be a sympathetic ear. You, as a home visitor, give a special gift of your time. Let people talk. Monsignor went on to say, "The wounds that Christ heals are the ones we bring to Him. Pray for the grace of forgiveness and pray for others. Remember the love that Christ has for others." Encourage the people we visit to go to confession. There are always people in our lives that we don't get along with. Monsignor suggested this little prayer. "May the love that Jesus has for (person's name) fill my heart at this moment. When you discover the love Christ has for you, you can love others and give that love back in many ways." God has a wonderful plan for all of us. Make the choice to follow God's plan for you. A Christian's job is liv-

ing in the present. Have a spirit of thanksgiving. Give thanks for all our blessings. The result will be happiness and emotional health. Forgiveness is much easier with a grateful heart.



Deacon Tom finished up the retreat for us with a short reflection of his own. He reminded us to follow the Gospels of Jesus. There were over 150 prayer requests in our newsletters from our Vincentians this past year. Deacon said how much your faith has impressed him. Make prayer an active part of your spiritual life. Fellowship, monthly meetings, retreats, other activities and events are spiritual reinforcement we get from each other.
